

Dear Parents and carers,

Christmas is now upon us and as we look forward to welcoming the New Year we also look back at the last term in 2022. As usual at Reddish Vale High School there has been a huge amount of activity with many highlights detailed within this newsletter.

This term, pupils have enjoyed museum and university trips, participated in The Youth Climate Group, enterprise challenges, careers and charity events and been awarded numerous rewards such as; Cake with the Head, Proud Thursday, celebration assemblies and an end of term excursion to the cinema. The performing arts team have been busy working alongside pupils in the Matilda JR production, which has been a great success.

We have been greatly impressed with the Year7 pupils who have settled in so well during their first term. They are very polite, full of character and are a credit to their parents. Year 11 pupils have engaged conscientiously in their recent mock examinations and have shown great work ethic and determination to progress. Pupils in all year groups are a credit to the school demonstrating excellent improvements in attendance, attainment and progress.

Quality first teaching remains a priority and significant work has been devoted to improving literacy and reading skills to support pupils in accessing the curriculum and deepening their knowledge and understanding. We continue to invest in interventions and initiatives to support personal development, academic growth and good mental wellbeing through; high quality teaching, personalised tutoring, Tutor Trust, Academic Mentors, and pastoral support.

Beyond the curriculum, our pupils have enjoyed opportunities to be involved in a variety of experiences and extracurricular activities. Participation rates are high and the number of pupils opting to enrol on The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme has increased significantly. We are incredibly proud of our Year 11 boy's football team who have progressed to the next stage of the National Cup. Sporting activities continue to be popular and spectator support at after school fixtures has been conducted in line with the



guidance laid out in our school code of conduct, therefore we acknowledge and appreciate this. Can I take the opportunity to remind parent's that pupils excluded or absent from school are not permitted to attend out of school hours activities on that day. In addition to this can we stress that pupils participating in practical activities must be suitably and safely dressed. The school does not allow pupils to participate in football during social times without wearing trainers, however appropriate school shoes must be worn in lessons and around the building.

Thank you to all parents that continue to support us with maintaining high standards and expectations. The vast majority of our pupils are immaculately dressed, arrive on time and behave appropriately. Can we remind parents and carers that pupils must be in full uniform coming to, during and returning from school. This includes appropriately wearing a blazer, shirt, tie, regular trousers/skirt and black shoes. Pupils are not permitted to wear trainers to school and the following items are banned; excessive makeup, mascara, false nails, false lashes, nail varnish, fake tan, jewellery, piercings, retainers, chewing gum and illegal items. In order to promote healthy eating energy drinks are banned and unhealthy snacks are restricted to one standard sized portion. Mobile phones are not permitted to be used anywhere on site and must be switched off before entering the school gates. These items, along with other banned items, will be confiscated if seen in school. Uniform checks, with an emphasis on keeping uniform standards high, will take place every morning on the gate. Bag searches occur on the gate each morning alongside random spot checks to ensure pupil safety, we trust you will support us with this preventative measure.

During the winter months we encourage pupils to wear a coat to school however they should not be worn inside the building. Should there be a need to shut the school due to poor weather conditions, parents will be notified and work will continue to be set remotely through Google Classroom.

We are aware that many of our families are struggling with the impact the current political, economic and financial situations are having on the cost of living. Community support has been welcomed from generous contributions provided from; The Hits Radio Mission Christmas appeal, Sedulo's Christmas Grotto and one of our governors, Kevin Shaw – A massive Thank You for supporting our school.



Our Parents Forum continues to be a supportive and collaborative network on which to consult on and influence decisions around; uniform, bullying, curriculum and interventions. Please be aware of the Governments Winter Support Scheme, details of which can be found on the website, should you require any advice, guidance or support.

Good attendance is vital to your child's success, punctuality is equally important, we are delighted to see improvements in attendance, however this is still below expectation. If pupils are not attending school, they are limiting their ability to achieve and this can also lead to educational penalty notices being issued for £120 from the Local Authority where attendance goes below 90%. It is vital that your child is on time to school, prepared for learning and that they start the day off well. Our minimum expected attendance target for each pupil is 96%.

Considerable improvements have been made to the school building over recent years, developments to the building, equipment and resources has enhanced the learning environment. Sadly a minority of pupils behave in a disrespectful manner; litter, misuse of toilets, damage to property and graffiti. These few incidents are swiftly dealt with and community tasks imposed. Please can you support us in speaking to your children about respecting the environment and encouraging their peers to do likewise to ensure a better learning environment for all.

We are very proud of our school and of our students and believe that high standards of uniform, behaviour, work ethic, being properly equipped and attending regularly give each and every one of our students the very best chance of learning well and achieving their very best. Thank you all very much in advance of your anticipated support and understanding.

We look forward tom welcoming pupils back to school on Monday 9th January 2023
