

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we enter the festive period, we reflect on another successful Autumn term here at Reddish Vale High School. Pupils have been working studiously towards and beyond aspirational targets. Quality first teaching remains a priority and significant work has been devoted to improving literacy and reading skills to support pupils in accessing the curriculum and deepening their knowledge and understanding. We continue to invest in interventions and initiatives to support personal development, academic growth and good mental wellbeing through; high quality teaching, personalised tutoring, Tutor Trust, Academic Mentors, and pastoral support.

In addition to this we were pleased to offer so many fantastic opportunities and rewards for our pupils, including trips to museums, theatres, educational workshops and motivational speakers, careers fairs, Sports trips and tournaments and an amazing Christmas finale of a music and dance showcase.

Pupils have participated in workshops led by Motivational Speaker and Education Professional, Sean Anthony Sherwood, where he spoke about building resilience and aspirations. Year 10 pupils attended Historian and Author David Olusoga's Black History Month lecture at the University of Manchester, which focused on the role of Black people in British History. We were very lucky to welcome record breaking adventurer and charity founder Alex Staniforth into school to share his experiences with our pupils with a focus on resilience and overcoming adversity through personal challenges. Many pupils participated in various sporting competitions such as the Stockport Cup, Stockport League Cup, Cheshire Cup, Greater Manchester Cup and English Schools Cup. Year 11 GCSE PE pupils spent time developing their rock climbing skills at the Parthian Climbing centre in Manchester.

We are grateful to parents and pupils that contributed to the poverty proofing audit as the information gathered has enabled us to reflect on practices that are helpful to our families and allow us to consider further opportunities to support.

We would also like to express our thanks to local businesses and members of our school community including our Chair of Governors, Kevin Shaw, The Toy Appeal and Ex-pupil, Paul Cheetham Karcz and his team at Sedulo, who kindly provided food and gift donations, enabling us to provide a large number of our families with food hampers and Christmas gifts, we are extremely grateful for their support.



Pupils in all year groups are a credit to the school demonstrating excellent improvements in attendance, attainment and progress. Thank you to all parents that continue to support us with maintaining high standards and expectations. The vast majority of our pupils are immaculately dressed, arrive on time and behave appropriately. Can we remind parents and carers that pupils must be in full uniform coming to, during and returning from school. This includes appropriately wearing a blazer, shirt, tie, regular trousers/skirt and black shoes. Pupils are not permitted to wear trainers to school and the following items are banned; excessive makeup, mascara, false nails, false lashes, nail varnish, fake tan, jewellery, piercings, retainers, chewing gum and illegal items.

In order to promote healthy eating, energy drinks are banned and unhealthy snacks are restricted to one standard sized portion. Mobile phones are not permitted to be used anywhere on site and must be switched off before entering the school gates. These items, along with other banned items, will be confiscated if seen in school. Uniform checks, with an emphasis on keeping uniform standards high, will take place every morning on the gate. Bag searches occur on the gate each morning alongside random spot checks to ensure pupil safety, we trust you will support us with this preventative measure.

During the winter months we encourage pupils to wear a coat to school however they should not be worn inside the building. Should there be a need to shut the school due to poor weather conditions, parents will be notified and work will continue to be set remotely through Google Classroom.

Good attendance is vital to your child's success, punctuality is equally important, we are delighted to see improvements in attendance, however this is still below expectation. If pupils are not attending school, they are limiting their ability to achieve and this can also lead to educational penalty notices being issued for £120 from the Local Authority where attendance goes below 90%. It is vital that your child is on time to school, prepared for learning and that they start the day off well. Our minimum expected attendance target for each pupil is 96%.

Considerable improvements have been made to the school building over recent years, developments to the building, equipment and resources has enhanced the learning environment. Sadly a minority of pupils behave in a disrespectful manner; litter, misuse of toilets, damage to property and graffiti. These few incidents are swiftly dealt with and community tasks imposed. Please can you support us in speaking to your children about respecting the environment and encouraging their peers to do likewise to ensure a better learning environment for all.



We are very proud of our school and of our pupils and believe that high standards of uniform, behaviour, work ethic, being properly equipped and attending regularly give each and every one of our pupils the very best chance of learning well and achieving their very best. Thank you all very much in advance of your anticipated support and understanding.

Engagement at our Parents Forum has been disappointing this term, particularly given that this has previously been a strong, supportive and collaborative network on which to consult on and influence decisions around; uniform, bullying, curriculum and interventions. We would welcome new participants as we appreciate parent voice when consulting and making decisions that affect your child directly. There is no expectations from parents at this forum other than to share their opinions and experiences.

We look forward to welcoming pupils back to school on Monday 8^h January 2024
